All Operations will deploy under a "Unified" Incident Command!

- **Note:** All Briefings begin with a review of the Incident Command System. Our mission depends on everyone speaking the same incident management language. Remember! When you're first to the scene, the first thing out of your mouth should be; "I TAKE COMMAND!" Immediately, identify the type, scope, and potential for incident' scope creep. CALL 9-1-1 and request appropriate response assets. Based on the scope and potential for scope creep either handle the incident as a "Single Command" or establish a Unified" command. *Rich Woldt – CEO: Risk Management Learning Center*



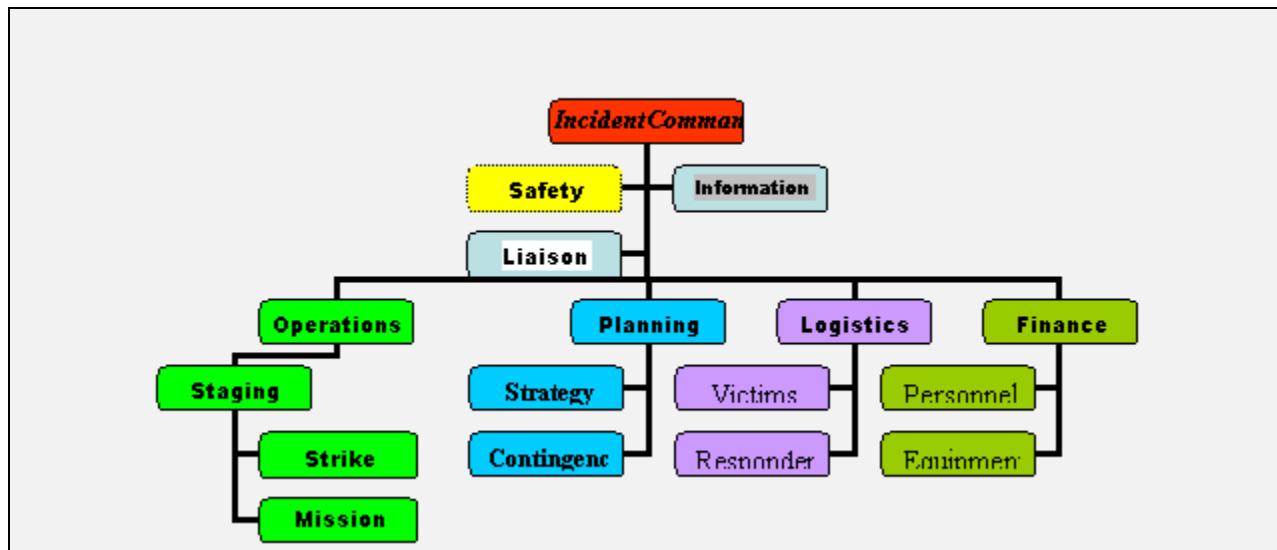
We speak the same ICS language spoken by our active military.

FYI: Color Coded: **IC is red**, **Safety Officer is yellow**, **Information Officer and Liaison Officers are light blue**, **Operations Chief is always green**, **Planning Chiefs are dark blue** and **Finance Chiefs are in the black**. Wisconsin is a “Home Rule” state. That means your local FIRE CHIEF rules the roost when it comes to life safety issues. The FIRE CHIEF works closely with all event Planning, Operations, Logistics, and Finance Chiefs. Incident Commander (IC) – Mission Focus and Objectives:

During any large scale event, it’s critically important that everyone speak the same “Incident Command and Control” language. While our mission in both “Boots on the Ground” and “Rubber hits the Road” is to mobilize all Door County residents in honor of our 5 veterans killed in action during the Vietnam War, our objective is to “field test” our “Private” sectors ability to mobilize Door County during a mass evacuation. Measurements of our success will include:

- How many residents, businesses, churches, clubs, associations, schools and students answer Roll-call,
- How many Door County residents are familiar with the Incident Command System, and
- How many will be able to pass a short Homeland Security test I call “Ready on Left – Ready on the Right – Prepare to Fire- FIRE!”

The final test will be how well both operations can be managed from the Board room of the “Lambeau” Credit Union in [Tobago West Indies](#).

- **FYI:** *We're using the Door County ride to field test our ability to mass-evacuate a large segment of our population during the next natural disaster, toxic waste spill, gas explosion, anthrax threat, etc. A significant part of the test includes establishing a financial support system that helps shelter, feed, medically assist, and track vulnerable citizens during the evacuation. For example: **Each biker will be carrying gift cards for fuel, food, and shelter provided by local businesses and national chains such as Target and McDonalds.** We use gift card because they can be tracked telling us not only where and how but why they were used. For example, when the card is refreshed for an even \$20 we know a child or medically dependent person has reached a responsible adult family member or hospital.*
- **If your business offers debt i.e. "gift cards" and you choose to provide each of our 10 riders with a card, cards not used will be turned over to Door County's Veteran Service Officer Scott McFarlane at the end of the ride.**

Operation "Boots-on-the-Ground"

- **Operation "Boots-on-the-Ground,"** we'll refer to as "**BOG,**" supports the statewide program May 20 – 24, 2010 that officially welcomes Wisconsin Vietnam Veterans Home to Landing Zone (LZ) Lambeau or Lambeau Field the home of the world champion Green Bay Packers.

BOG enlists all Door County residents in a mission to locate and land all Door County Vietnam vets with family members of the 5 KIA inside Lambeau Field before 7:30 p.m. May 22; the official "Welcome Home" for Wisconsin Vietnam Veterans."

Operation "Rubber-hits-the-Road"



- **Operation "Rubber-hits-the-Road"** enlists bikers on Friday, May 21, 2010 in the Memorial ride of 1244 (The number of Wisconsin Vietnam vets Killed-in-

Action (KIA), Missing-in-Action (MIA) or were Prisoners-of-War (POWs). **The "one-way" ride is symbolic of the 5 who did not make it home.** It will start on Washington Island the home of KIA Richard Perez, and travel south past all four High Schools from where the other 4 Door County KIAs graduated and land safely at Landing Zone (LZ) Lambeau.

Northeast Wisconsin Bikers Association (NEWBA) founder and President Owen "OB1" Bergwin will be our liaison with all biker organizations to include Door/Kewaunee County's TITANs, Door Devils, Road Rebels, and Devils Knights; as well as with Rolling Thunder MC, the Patriot Guard MC, and Warriors Watch.

Five (5) Door County bikers lead by OB1 will ride in Rolling Thunders' official LZ Lambeau ride from La Crosse to LZ Lambeau leaving La Crosse in one of the 11 waves beginning at 0630 hours (6:30 a.m.) Friday, May 21. The 11 waves were based on the 11Bravo MOS (Military Occupational Specialty) which is the primary infantry MOS of every Vietnam Veteran.

Five (5) Door County bikers lead by the Door Devils MC will deploy from Staging Area #3 (Pioneer Credit Union branch parking lot at 1449 Green Bay Road, Sturgeon Bay) at 0630 hours (6:30 a.m.) heading first north past KIA gravesites to Staging Area #2 (Viking Grill in Ellison Bay) where they'll merge with bikers coming from Washington Island and lead the ride from Staging Area #2 to LZ Lambeau.

LZ LAMBEAU

Television viewers and radio listeners may have heard about "LZ Lambeau" but still wonder what this event is all about.

There are actually several, connected events, held over a three day period from Friday May 21, to

Sunday, May 23. This event will recognize men and women killed in action (KIA) in Vietnam and officially “Welcome Home” the thousands of soldiers, sailors and airmen who served in the United States military during that time. Many who returned from Vietnam were wounded in spirit when they returned, facing what appeared to be an apathetic, unsupportive, and occasionally angry, American public. LZ Lambeau is an event that may provide that overdue welcoming atmosphere, along with a heavy dose of honor and respect for those who fought.

Events

The centerpiece of the three-day experience will be the ½ scale replica of the Washington D.C. Vietnam Memorial. Named the “Moving Wall” for its emotional impact (as well as portability by semi from location to location) these black granite slabs will bring to Lambeau the names of over 55,000 men and women killed as a result of action in Viet Nam. Relatives, friends and members of the public will be invited to locate names of their loved ones on the Wall, placed under honorary guard by members of various area military service organizations for the duration of the LZ Lambeau exhibit.

A motorcycle ride across Wisconsin Friday, May 21 will feature 1244 riders, with each one designated to ride for a specific name of a Wisconsin soldier KIA. These riders, dubbed “Rolling Thunder” (joined perhaps by several thousand more if weather is good) will be welcomed by a public Flag Line as they approach the Lambeau Field parking area at approximately 2:30 p.m. Landing Zone Lambeau, or LZ Lambeau, takes its name from the reliance on helo operations in the field. A Huey helicopter, Vietnam era workhorse, will land in the parking lot and will remain on display over the weekend, along with military transport vehicles.

Saturday evening (starts at 7:30 p.m.) a special program with speakers and musical entertainment will be held inside the stadium. This is a ticketed event, and veterans, their families, and the public (as tickets are available) are invited to attend. Post 402 of Washington Island has one block of tickets available. This program, and other LZ Lambeau events are sponsored by these organizations: Wisconsin Public Television; Wisconsin State Historical Archives; Department of Veterans Affairs; Wisconsin’s Indian Nations; Green Bay Packers; the City of Green Bay and others.

Door County’s Honor Motorcade and Washington Island Participation

Early Friday morning, May 21 at 6:15 a.m., family, friends, and supportive community members will gather at the Island Cemetery grave of Lance Corporal Rick Perez, son of Mae Williamson. A U.S. Marine with three weeks remaining on his Vietnam tour, Perez was killed-in-action by an explosion on Sept. 6, 1969. A brief ceremony in his honor will include prayer, laying of a wreath, and bagpipers. Post 402 requests a turnout of community support for this event.

The reason for a ceremony at daybreak is that participants at this early event will join a Motorcade on the peninsula. Islanders and their vehicles honoring Rick Perez will board the early ferry. They will join upon arrival at Northport (7:30 a.m.) a motor vehicle formation led by Sheriff Vogel. The Honor Motorcade will process through small peninsula villages and past cemeteries where the other four Door County men who were killed-in-action in Vietnam are buried. This procession will stop at the Door

County Memorial on Michigan St., near the Sturgeon Bay City Hall. There (at approximately 10 a.m.) a second ceremony will pay tribute to all five Door County men KIA in Vietnam. Washington Island American Legion Post 402 members will also participate in this event.

At the conclusion of the Sturgeon Bay ceremony, individuals may elect to proceed to LZ Lambeau in Green Bay and join in greeting the 1244+ motorcycle riders from LaCrosse, and in viewing the various Vietnam exhibits. (Note: LZ Lambeau parking lot exhibits are FREE and open to the public Friday, Saturday and Sunday.)

Persons who intend to participate in the Door County Honor Motorcade, please contact Post 402 Commander Dick Purinton (we want to ensure enough vehicle space is available on the early morning ferry May 21st). Stadium seating tickets for the LZ Lambeau Saturday evening show may be obtained from Purinton, with first option to Perez family members, then Post 402 and Vietnam veterans, and to supportive members of the public.

Briefing on Rolling Thunder 1244 Ride from Door County CVSO

NEW DETAILS ANNOUNCED FOR LZ LAMBEAU MOTORCYCLE HONOR RIDE

See new details below about expanded family and veteran participation in ride from La Crosse to Green Bay

All Vietnam and Vietnam-era veterans, all other veterans, and IMMEDIATE family members are eligible to register. When **registration closes on May 12**, the organizers will count how many Vietnam and Vietnam-era veterans have registered for the ride and give them first choice at being among the Honor Riders. If that number is less than 1,244, then other veterans and those riding for a specific Vietnam KIA or MIA relative (perhaps a son or daughter riding for their father) will be asked to join the Honor Riders.

The Honor Riders will essentially "ride point" from La Crosse to Green Bay. Other riders will make up the "rear guard" for the Honor Ride. Like the Honor Riders, all riders will be leaving La Crosse in smaller groups at different intervals to avoid congestion and collisions on the road.

Specific details about the times and routes, along with the "rules of the road," will be sent to registered riders by May 17. **We encourage you to register online at LZLambeau.org** for a quicker response, but there is a printable document to give to those without computer access, with a mailing address included. **Registration for the Honor Ride is free.**

There will be a **MANDATORY Safety Meeting in La Crosse Thursday evening, May 20**. The time and location is yet to be determined. After the Safety Meetings, there will be a Meet & Greet party for attendees with music and pizza.

At the La Crosse meetings, the designated Honor Riders will be informed of an Honor Ride package from Global recognition to include a LZ Lambeau Honor Ride patch, windscreen logo, hatpin, and a LZ Lambeau Honor Ride challenge coin. This package costs \$20, a portion of which will go to Vietnam veteran organizations and to help defray the cost of the ride. Other Honor Ride patches and souvenirs, as well as LZ Lambeau memorabilia will be available at Green Bay on the Lambeau grounds.

Tracking our ten Honor Riders

We'll follow our RMLC "Executive Protection" protocols to include tracking through food, fuel, and pharmacy debit cards, unite tags, flags, and flashers.

Observers to include the media, our forward observers, and those positioned to benchmark the ride and the chopper pilot flying over the 1244 will be put on alert 72 hours prior to deployment.

For ID purposes: Chris J. Cornelius from VFW post 7784 Oneida cell 920-713-6422 freedomcc@peoplepc.com has been added to our "Unified" command. She will be in the chopper over the 1244 starting at noon Friday, loading out of Timber Rattler Stadium. She will work in Congressman Kagen's office this summer.

Personal Memories – By Rich Woldt Past Commander VFW Post 8337

Randy Wagner, Lee Patza and I left Egg Harbor about the same time. Lee landed in Vietnam March 23, 1968, Randy on September 11, 1968 and I on November 10, 1968. Randy was killed by a demolition bomb on November 11, 1968 the day after I landed at Long Bien Ben Hue.

David Schaefer, son of Roy and Helen (Rohr) Schaefer, Sturgeon Bay, landed in the Mekong Delta as part of the Ninth Infantry Division on March 1, 1969 and was killed May 1, 1969 61 days later, leaving three brothers; Steve, Rick and Mark and paternal grandmother, Nellie Schaefer behind. I remember hanging out with David at the family Shell Station on Jefferson.

Sergeant Schaefer was awarded several medals posthumously for valor in combat. The Silver Star with 1st Oak Leaf Cluster. The first was for picking up an armed Vietcong grenade from beneath a wounded soldier and hurling it away, where it exploded shortly thereafter. The second was for courageously leading an attack against a Vietcong bunker where he took machine gun fire that cost him his life. Also awarded were the Bronze Star and Bronze Star first Oak Leaf Cluster for meritorious achievement while participating in sustained aerial flight in support of combat forces and the Purple Heart.

Rick Perez, Washington Island, was scheduled to leave for home on September 22 (we called it "DEROS" to "CONUS" or "Date Expected to Return from Overseas to Continental United States"). He was killed by a fragmentation grenade in Quang Nam province on September 6, 1969; sixteen days before he would have safely landed home.

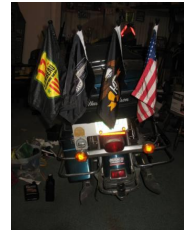
Lee landed safely back in the U.S. February 9, 1969. I was scheduled to go home November 10, 1968 but extended my tour to get the SOB who killed Randy. I landed back in the U.S. January 10, 1970.

Dan Pfister, born in Jacksonport, had been in the Army since 1955. He was the oldest and first Door County vet to be killed in Vietnam. We called him a "Brown Boot" because once you're in Nam for over a week you're boots are red-brown from the mud in the rivers. Dan was a medic on an operation out of Binh Thuan when he was first listed as MIA but than the same day (June 18, 1968), his body was recovered and he was official reported as Killed in Action.

Philip Overbeck, Son of Henry and Thea, brother of William and Charles and Michael and Margi and Elizabeth and Jennifer; a 1965 graduate of Sturgeon Bay High School, was the fifth and last Door County vet to be Killed in Action on June 10, 1970. Phil was a paratrooper serving with the 173 Airborne Brigade, Company B-4, 503 Infantry when he was killed by an explosive device while on an operation out of Binh Dinh. Phil's brothers William and Charles are both Vietnam vets.

We must never apologize for defending our freedom!

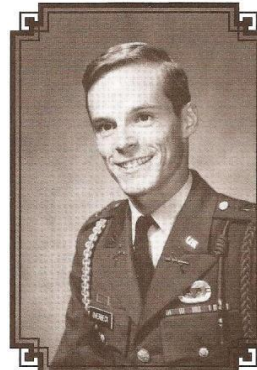

- **Two (2)** will deploy to Bayside Cemetery and place a flag at the gravesite of:




- **Four (4)** bikers will assemble in front of the Pioneer Store (North of the Viking Grill) at 7:30 a.m. and stand ready to welcome the fifth biker arriving from Northport.
- **Following is a "TENTATIVE" time-line and route: Road Captains will post a final schedule on this website after the safety meeting Wednesday night May 19.**
- **At 0800 hours (8 a.m.),** all five bikes representing our five KIAs will escort Door County residents in cars, trucks, busses, and three wheelers down #42 past Gibraltar High School, past Randy Wagner's gravesite at the Egg Harbor Cemetery to a point where they'll head over to #57 north of Institute and pass David Schaefer's gravesite at St. Peter and Paul's Catholic Cemetery, than past Sevastopol High School, and on to Sturgeon Bay past Sturgeon Bay High School, before merging with Door County residence waiting in Pioneer Credit Union parking lot at 1449 Green Bay Road.
- **Our target is to be in the Pioneer Credit Union parking lot (825 Morris Ave)** two blocks due south of Lambeau Field before high noon so Door County bikers can join the Flag-line through which the 1244 bikers, including OB1's, squad will ride.

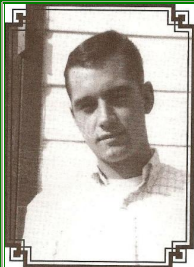

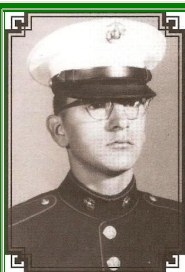

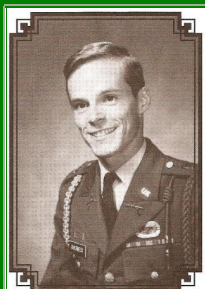

Washington Is. KIA September 6, 1969 RIP Island Cemetery

If Washington Island students plan to take part in “Education Day” at LZ Lambeau, the Sheriff’s deputy followed by veterans on motorcycles, cars and trucks, and student busses will proceed to the mainland to arrive at Northport no later than 7 a.m. where they’ll be met by the Sheriff and the five bikers representing the five Door County veterans Killed in Action during the Vietnam War. The target is to have all Washington Island vehicles planning to be in the ride at Staging Area #2 no later than 8 a.m.

Important Note: Saturday’s operation “Boots on the Ground” is focused on the families of our 5 KIA’s. While family members may choose to be included in the ceremonies at graveside and the ride, the focus of the ride will be on the 5 bikers representing our fallen heroes. Refer to our briefings on “Boots on the Ground” to include our mission to locate KIA family members.

Door County veterans have joined the State wide effort to welcome Vietnam vets home to Lambeau Field while honoring our 5 Door County’ vets Killed in Action (KIA) during the Vietnam War. They’ve launched two operations:

- **Operation "Boots-on-the-Ground"** enlists all Door County residents in a mission to locate and land all Door County Vietnam vets with family members of our 5 KIAs inside Lambeau Field before **7:30 p.m. May 22**; the official "Welcome Home Wisconsin Vietnam Veterans."
- **Operation "Rubber-hits-the-Road"** enlists bikers on **Friday, May 21**, in the Memorial ride of 1244 (The number of Wisconsin Vietnam vets Killed in Action (KIA), Missing in Action (MIA) or were Prisoners of War (POWs). **Our "one-way" ride symbolic of our 5 who did not make it home will start on Washington Island** the home of KIA Richard Perez, and travel south past KIA' grave sites and High Schools from where they graduated.
